President's Order No. 85 of 1972

THE BANGLADESH GOVERNMENT AND LOCAL AUTHORITY LANDS AND BUILDINGS (RECOVERY OF POSSESSION) CREER, 1972.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the East Pakistan Government and Local Authority Lands and Buildings (Recovery of Possession) Ordinance, 1970, for the purpose hereinafter appearing;

Now, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation of Independence of Bangladesh, read with the Provisional Constitution of Bangladesh Order, 1972, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President is pleased to make the following Order:—

- 1. (1) This Order may be called the Bangladesh Government and Authority Lands and Buildings (Recovery of Possession) Order, 1972.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.

2. In the East Pakistan Government and Local Authority Lands and Buildings (Recovery of Possession) Ordinance, 1970 (E. P. Ordinance No. XXIV of 1970), in section 5, in sub-section (1), for the "full stop" at the end, a "colon" shall be substituted and thereafter the following proviso shall be added, namely:—

"Provided that the Deputy Commissioner may, where he is satisfied that thirty days' notice will not be in public interest, reduce the period of such notice to not less than seven days.".
